

## STANDING RULES FOR 2010

1. A Lifetime, Paid-up C.A.R.B. Membership can be given to a C.A.R.B. member in good standing who has given their time, interest, and dedicated service promoting the continuance of C.A.R.B. A member in good standing shall give nominees for the presentation to the President, in writing. Upon receipt of the nomination, the President shall present it to the Board of Directors for a vote of approval. Upon approval of the Board, the Lifetime Award nomination shall be presented to the membership for a vote of approval.

3. C.A.R.B. Night Presentations.

Monies paid out for feature races in each class will be \$15.00 to all C.A.R.B. member drivers starting the "A" feature race.

4. Private Awards Presented at the Annual Banquet.

- a. Woman of the Year (Anonymous)
- b. Any C.A.R.B. supported track Trophies and Awards.
- c. Any additional awards to be presented must be voted on by the Board.
- d. Any awards ordered through C.A.R.B. must be paid for by November 1.

5. Club Expenditures

- a. Expenditures up to and including \$300.00, require only Board approval. Expenditures over \$300.00 require General Membership approval.
- b. In the event of the death of a member in good standing of C.A.R.B., or a member of their immediate family, the Club will send a Floral Offering.
  - (1) Immediate family shall be defined as Parents, Spouse, Children and Siblings.
  - (2) Floral or Fifty (\$50) dollar contribution shall be paid for from the Benevolent Fund
- c. For every free membership, \$2 will be transferred from the General Fund to the Benevolent Fund.

6. Benevolent Fund Expenditures.

The definition of "Benevolent" as found in Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary, 1977 edition, is as follows: (a) marked by or disposed to doing good; (b) organized for the purpose of doing good; (c) marked by or suggestive of good will.

- a. In case of injury to a participating driver at a C.A.R.B. supported track who is incapacitated for at least one week, the Treasurer shall pay said driver an initial sum of \$150.00 per incapacitation per week up to 3 weeks. If the injured driver is incapacitated for a period of three months or more, the sum of \$500.00 shall be paid to said driver by the Treasurer. If a driver is killed in competition then \$500.00 shall be paid to the driver's immediate family.
- b. Any driver who is a member of C.A.R.B., or drives at a C.A.R.B. supported track, which is injured while racing at any track and is incapacitated as stated in 6a, shall receive the same benefits as stated in 6a.

7. The Treasurer will be furnished with a petty cash fund not to exceed \$200.00 for C.A.R.B.'s business functions.

8. Any new tracks that wish to be supported by C.A.R.B. must first make their proposal to the Board of Directors and have Board approval.
9. The incoming President may appoint a Chairperson for Hospitality, Chaplain, Photographer, Database Administrator and Publicist, if so desired.
10. In addition to the Treasurer and President, the Secretary may sign checks.
11. The Central Auto Racing Boosters have established a Hall of Fame of Kansas City with following rules:
  - a. Who May Nominate: Any C.A.R.B. Member in good standing may submit a name for consideration as a Hall of Fame Candidate. Non-members must pay a yearly \$10 membership fee in order to submit a nomination.
  - b. Criteria and Qualifications
    - (1) Anyone (Driver, Track Employee, Track Owner, Car Builder, Engine Builder, Car Owner, Mechanic, Crew Chief, Pit Crew, Former or Current C.A.R.B. Member, Individual Sponsor, Media Person, Fan - anyone who has contributed to the advancement of Circle or Figure 8 track racing in the state of Missouri or Kansas can be nominated.
    - (2) *Add for Clarification: Nominees who have been out of racing for two years or longer will be considered automatically eligible. Active nominees will be considered eligible provided their contribution is and has been ongoing for a minimum of 20 years.*
    - (3) Five members will be inducted into the Central Auto Racing Boosters Hall of Fame of Kansas City each year.
    - (4) Each Inductee to the Central Auto Racing Boosters Hall of Fame of Kansas City will be presented an Award at the *annual* C.A.R.B. Hall of Fame Appreciation Award Dinner *held in March*.
    - (5) Recipients, or those representing the Recipient posthumously, should be able to attend the C.A.R.B. Hall of Fame Award Dinner.
    - (6) Recipients, or their representative, not able to attend the Hall of Fame Award Dinner will have the award made in their absence.
    - (7) All selections by the Central Auto Racing Boosters Hall of Fame of Kansas City selection Committee shall be final.
    - (8) The intent of the Central Auto Racing Boosters Hall of Fame is to honor those deserving individuals since the inception of this club in 1952. In 2010 those individuals whose racing contributions occurred before the creation of the organization and whose contributions per the Selection Committee our deserving of inclusion into the Hall of Fame will be inducted as a one time Pioneer Class. All subsequent C.A.R.B. Hall of Fame inductees will be judged on their contributions to racing from 1952 to the Present.
  - c. The completed nomination form must be submitted to the current Hall of Fame Chairperson by the deadline of December 1 each year.

12. *Unsung Hero Award: C.A.R.B. will make this award at the banquet. The award is presented to someone who works behind the scenes at the race track to make each racing event a success. Nominees for this award will come from the C.A.R.B. supported race track owners, it may be only one nominee or several. If the owners nominate two or more deserving individuals the Officers and Board of Directors will vote to determine who receives this award.*
